

<p><u>Project 1: Lawton Farm</u></p> <p>Reopening trail loop:</p> <p>There is a trail loop along the western edge of the property which has been abandoned. That section of the trail will be reestablished.</p> <p>Boardwalk over wet areas:</p> <p>There are three areas where seasonal high water impairs trail access, as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eastern approach to footbridge crossing Cranberry Brook • Trail along southern edge of Field 3 approaching woodland loop • New Trail Loop <p>Pet Waste Eliminator Station:</p> <p>We intend to install a pet waste eliminator system (i.e. doggie bags and waste collection) to assist pet owners with cleaning up after their dogs. The Town of Scituate will remove collected trash.</p> <p>Directional/educational signs (3), tree identification signs, and trail markers:</p> <p>We intend to install 3 signs at various points along the trails which will include a trail map (i.e 'you are here'). Signs will be installed between Fields 2 and 3, at the old parking lot site, and at Cranberry Brook. Tree identification markers/signs, similar to those we have installed at Westconnaug Meadows, will also be installed along the trail. <p><u>Project 2: Westconnaug Meadows</u></p> <p>Kiosk:</p> <p>We will install a kiosk at the entrance to the trail. The kiosk will include a trail map as well as historical, cultural, and educational information about the property.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Grant Funding \$11,035.00 Match Funding \$1,523.20 Total Cost: \$12,558.20</p> <p><i>Phase 1: Designing and ordering signs and pet waste station</i></p>

<p>Pet Waste Eliminator Station:</p> <p>We intend to install a pet waste eliminator system (i.e. doggie bags and waste collection) to assist pet owners with cleaning up after their dogs. The Town of Scituate will remove collected trash.</p> <p>Entrance sign, directional/educational signs (2), tree identification signs, and trail markers:</p> <p>We intend to install an entrance sign at the parking lot entrance on George Washington Highway to make it easier to find and access the site. We also intend to install 2 signs at various points along the trails which will include a trail map (i.e 'you are here'). Signs will be installed near the vernal pool and near the big boulder feature. Tree identification markers/signs will also be installed along the trail. We also intend to install trail markers of various colors on trees so hikers can easily identify and navigate the trails.</p>	
<p><u>Project 3: Esek Hopkins Park</u></p> <p>Landing Area:</p> <p>Clear and grade landing area, develop accessible nature trail and accessible parking area. Install kiosk, benches, directional and educational signs, plant identification markers, and trail markers.</p> <p>Quarry Trail:</p> <p>Develop new accessible trail in the quarry area. Install bench, directional and educational signs, and trail markers.</p> <p>Field Access Improvements:</p> <p>Parking upgrade (accessible), accessible path from parking lot to concessions, trailhead, composting toilet/restroom.</p> <p>Kiosks:</p> <p>We intend to install a kiosk at the edge of the parking lot. The kiosk will include a trail map as well as historical, cultural, and educational information about the property.</p>	<p><i>RIDEM Funding:</i> <i>Grant Funding \$10,656.00</i> <i>Match Funding \$1,577.60</i> <i>Total Cost: \$12,233.60</i></p> <p><i>Federal Funding:</i> <i>Grant Funding \$290,000.00</i> <i>Match Funding \$73,680.40</i> <i>Total Cost: \$363,680.40</i></p> <p><i>Phase 1: Clearing and grading landing; nature trail development; parking lot design and prep; designing and ordering signs and pet waste station</i></p>

<p>Pet Waste Eliminator Station:</p> <p>We intend to install a pet waste eliminator system (i.e. doggie bags and waste collection) to assist pet owners with cleaning up after their dogs. The Town of Scituate will remove collected trash.</p> <p>Trailhead sign, directional/educational signs, tree identification signs, and trail markers:</p> <p>We intend to install trailhead signs at the entrances to make it easier to find and access the trail. We also intend to install signs at various points along the trails which will include a trail map (i.e 'you are here'). Tree identification markers/signs will also be installed along the trail. We also intend to install trail markers of various colors on trees so hikers can easily identify and navigate the trails.</p> <p>Reforestation:</p> <p>Planting to replace native trees damaged by spongy moth infestation.</p>	
<p><u>Project 4: Doctor's Lane Trails</u></p> <p>New Parking Lot:</p> <p>We intend to open a new parking area to provide improved access to the Doctor's Lane trails. The Town of Scituate owns a lot along Route 116 that abuts the Doctor's Lane trail areas. This lot will be developed as a new parking lot to allow access to the hiking trails and take the vehicular pressure off North Doctor's Lane.</p> <p>Kiosks (2):</p> <p>We will install two kiosks on this property. The first one will be installed at the new parking lot and the second one at the existing parking area on North Doctor's Lane.</p> <p>Pet Waste Eliminator Stations (2):</p> <p>We intend to install 2 pet waste eliminator systems (i.e. doggie bags and waste collection) to assist pet owners with cleaning up after their dogs, one near each parking area. The Town of Scituate will remove collected trash.</p>	<p><i>Grant Funding \$68,227.50</i> <i>Match Funding \$13,242.80</i> <i>Total Cost: \$81,470.30</i></p> <p><i>Phase 1: Parking Lot, designing and ordering signs and pet waste station</i></p>

<p>Entrance/trailhead signs (2), directional/educational signs (3), tree identification signs, and trail markers:</p> <p>We intend to install 2 entrance/trailhead signs, one at each parking area, to make it easier to find and access the site. We also intend to install 3 signs at various points along the trails which will include a trail map (i.e 'you are here'). Signs will be installed along the wooded trail, near the vernal pool/river area, and at the upper river site. Tree identification markers/signs will also be installed along the trail. We also intend to install trail markers of various colors on trees so hikers can easily identify and navigate the trails.</p>
